A batch was recently sent off and is now in Norfolk, Virginia waiting for shipping overseas with a medical mission team. Others were also sent to El Salvador via Canadian Food for Children. DKC legal advisor Catherine Osborne spoke to the audience about some legal woes that have befallen the guild. A vendor from the 2010 Frolic has sued the Japanese Canadian Cultural Centre for an alleged injury, and the DKC was subsequently sued by the JCCC's insurance company. Since the DKC is not incorporated, Wendy and Carole were named personally in the suit as their names were on the contract with the ICCC. Catherine called the lawsuit a "nuisance claim" and assured members that the lawyer the guild has found is great, and will get results. In the mean time, the executive is looking into getting the guild incorporated to prevent individual members from being sued in the future.
